It is with great pride that I introduce the first-ever Impact Report for The Jackpot Community Trust (JCT). This report marks a significant milestone in our journey, highlighting the remarkable impact we have made in 2024. As Chair of JCT, I am delighted to share our achievements, our partnerships, and our vision for the future.

At JCT, our mission is simple yet powerful: to provide vital funding to charities across the country, ensuring they can continue their invaluable work. Through The Scotto, our flagship lottery, we have been able to support a range of causes that align with our commitment to education, health, social development, community engagement, and much more. Our approach to funding is unique, operating through a closed application process that allows us to build meaningful, long-term partnerships with charities, giving them the financial stability needed to make a real difference.

2024 has been an incredible year. Thanks to the unwavering support of our lottery players, JCT has distributed over £220,000 to our charity partners. Since our inception in late 2023, we have raised close to £260,000, an achievement we are immensely proud of. This funding has directly supported four outstanding organisations: Calum's Cabin, SAMH (Scottish Action for Mental Health), House of Hope, and the Scottish Children's Lottery Trust. Each of these charities provides crucial services to those in need, from supporting families affected by childhood cancer to improving mental health services and providing opportunities for children and young people.

Another standout moment was our visit to the headquarters of SAMH (Scottish Action for Mental Health), where we presented a cheque for £50,000 after spending a day on the streets of Glasgow, engaging the public and asking them, "What makes you happy?" The energy and responses we received reinforced just how important mental well-being is and why the work SAMH does is so essential. Similarly, we were proud to support House of Hope in securing their Wellbeing Centre

in Edinburgh, ensuring they have a stable base to continue their much-needed services. The creation of the Bright Futures Fund, in partnership with the Scottish Children's Lottery Trust, was another significant milestone, supporting over 15,000 children and young people in Scotland.

JCT's approach to funding is unique. We do not simply provide one-off grants; instead, we establish committed partnerships with charities that allow them to plan ahead and create lasting impact. The current funding climate for charities is incredibly challenging, with demand far exceeding available resources. By offering long-term funding partnerships, JCT provides our partners with the security and stability needed to focus on their vital work rather than worrying about financial sustainability.

Empowering Change: The Role of Our Players

Of course, none of this would be possible without the incredible support of The Scotto players. It is because of them that we were able to generate over £260,000 in funding to support our charity partners in 2024 alone. Their participation in the lottery is not just about the chance to win prizes; it's about contributing to something far greater – helping charities make real differences in people's lives. To every single player who has taken part, I want to say a massive thank you. Your support is the backbone of everything we do.

The Road Ahead

This will be a Great Britain-wide lottery, opening doors to supporting even more incredible causes across the country. We have already confirmed two charity partners and look forward to announcing them in early 2025.

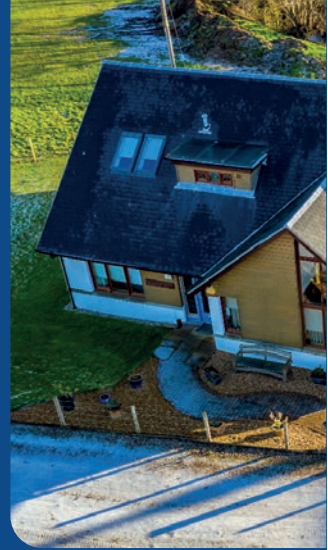

The Scotto's First Step in Giving: Calum's Cabin expands it's vital work thanks to £70,000 From The Scotto



For families navigating the unimaginable journey of childhood cancer, moments of respite and togetherness are invaluable. Calum's Cabin provides just that – a sanctuary where families can take a break from hospital stays and treatments, spend quality time together, and create irreplaceable memories. Since its inception, the charity has touched countless lives, offering holiday accommodation and home-from-home stays for families across Scotland.

A Mission Inspired by Love

Calum's Cabin was founded in memory of Calum Speirs, a brave young boy who, despite battling an inoperable brain tumour, dreamed of helping other children facing similar challenges. After his passing in 2007, his family – parents Duncan and Caroline and twin sister Jenna – turned his dream into reality, establishing a retreat on the Isle of Bute where families could escape the stresses of childhood cancer.

From humble beginnings, Calum's Cabin has grown significantly. The charity now provides multiple holiday homes on the Isle of Bute, Anstruther, and Dumfries House in Ayrshire. In addition, they offer crucial accommodation in Glasgow for families traveling from afar for cancer treatment. Their twelve Glasgow flats ensure that families can stay together in a comfortable and supportive environment while their child receives essential medical care.

The Partnership with JCT and The Scotto

In late 2023, Calum's Cabin became the first official charity partner of The Scotto and Jackpot Community Trust (JCT). This partnership was a milestone moment, marking the beginning of JCT's philanthropic journey and setting the tone for future collaborations.

To date, Calum's Cabin has received an incredible £70,000 in funding from The Scotto and JCT. This support has been instrumental in allowing the charity to expand its reach, secure additional family flats, taking their portfolio to 14, and continuing its essential mindfulness sessions for families. With an average holiday costing between £800 and £1,000, the charity has utilised a proportion of our donation to facilitate breaks for an additional 48 families, giving them precious moments of relief and joy amid their difficult journey.

Beyond Financial Support: A Meaningful Connection

JCT's relationship with Calum's Cabin extends far beyond financial contributions. Over the past year, the partnership has been enriched by active participation in the charity's events and initiatives.

We have attended key fundraising events, including Calum's Cabin's Women's Lunch, Golf Days, and charity fundraisers, demonstrating their commitment to the cause. A standout moment was when The Scotto's ambassador, Tommy Tucker, took to the dance floor for the charity's "Strictly Come Dancing" event, adding an extra layer of excitement and awareness to the cause.

One of the most meaningful days of the partnership was spent on the Isle of Bute, where we had the privilege of witnessing the impact of Calum's Cabin firsthand. We visited the holiday lodges, met families who have benefitted from the facilities, and recorded heartfelt stories of resilience, hope, and gratitude. The visit also provided an opportunity to meet the charity's dedicated volunteers, explore the charity

boutique, and surprise Calum's Cabin with an additional donation – further solidifying the deep connection between The Scotto, JCT and the charity.

Looking Ahead:

A Future of Continued Support

The partnership between JCT and Calum's Cabin is far from over. Looking ahead to 2025, JCT has reaffirmed its commitment to supporting the charity in its mission to provide comfort and relief to families facing childhood cancer.

Calum's Cabin has ambitious plans for the future. The charity hopes to expand its accommodation offering further, ensuring that even more families can benefit from their services. There are also discussions about extending their reach to other cities where families require support close to hospitals. With JCT's continued backing, these dreams are within reach.

The Scotto Funding Helps Save Lives with SAMH



For over a century, Scottish Action for Mental Health (SAMH) has been a cornerstone of mental health support in Scotland. Established in 1923, SAMH has grown to become Scotland's leading mental health charity, providing critical services that support individuals facing mental health challenges. Their mission is simple yet powerful: to be there for people when they need it most.



SAMH operates more than 70 services across Scotland, covering everything from therapeutic horticulture and peer support to employment training and suicide prevention initiatives. They focus on breaking down stigma, providing essential mental health resources, and ensuring that everyone, regardless of background or circumstance, can access the help they need. Their work extends beyond direct services, influencing national policies and campaigns to create a Scotland where mental health is a priority for all.

With the demand for mental health support increasing every year, SAMH plays a vital role in helping people regain confidence, build resilience, and take steps towards recovery. Their work supports those struggling with depression, anxiety, addiction, homelessness, and employment challenges, ensuring they have access to practical support and guidance tailored to their individual needs.

Partnering with The Scotto and Jackpot Community Trust

In early 2024, SAMH became the second official charity partner of The Scotto and the Jackpot Community Trust (JCT). This partnership was formed with a shared commitment to supporting mental well-being across Scotland, ensuring that individuals and families have access to trusted mental health resources.

To date, JCT has donated £50,000 to SAMH, with the funding specifically directed towards SAMH's Information Service – a vital lifeline for people seeking mental health support. This service provides clear, reliable, and easily accessible mental health guidance, helping people navigate their struggles and find appropriate support networks.

The impact of the service so far:

phone calls handled – an average of 281 per month, offering direct, compassionate support.

Through The Scotto's support, SAMH has been able to reach more people than ever before, providing hope, guidance, and reassurance to those facing mental health challenges.

A standout moment was the launch of a charity video campaign titled “What Makes You Happy?”. This heartwarming campaign featured The Scotto’s ambassador and TV advert star, Tommy Tucker, who took to the streets of Glasgow to engage the public in conversations about happiness and mental well-being.

The video captured candid, uplifting moments where people shared what truly makes them happy, reinforcing the importance of focusing on the positives in life. The campaign then took viewers on a journey to SAMH’s headquarters, where Tommy met with



SAMH CEO Billy Watson to learn more about the charity’s incredible work. The video concluded with a special cheque presentation, with The Scotto donating £50,000 to support SAMH’s Information Service.

This initiative wasn’t just about presenting a cheque – it was about starting conversations, raising awareness, and showing the impact that funding has on real people. By highlighting the work of SAMH in an engaging and accessible way, the campaign helped spark important discussions about mental health and well-being across Scotland.

The Scotto’s Gift of Hope:

JCT Funds Transformative New Breast Cancer Wellbeing Centre

A breast cancer diagnosis can be life-changing, bringing uncertainty, fear, and emotional upheaval. But for those in Scotland, a new beacon of support is on the horizon. The House of Hope, a soon-to-be-opened wellbeing centre in Edinburgh, is set to provide a vital lifeline for individuals affected by breast cancer. Thanks to generous funding from The Scotto and the Jackpot Community Trust (JCT), this vision is becoming a reality.

A Safe Haven in the Heart of Scotland

The House of Hope is more than just a building – it's a community, a sanctuary, and a space where individuals impacted by breast cancer can find comfort, connection, and support beyond medical treatment. Founded by Lisa Fleming after her own secondary breast cancer diagnosis in 2017, the charity's mission is clear: to enhance the quality of life for those affected by breast cancer by offering holistic therapies, wellbeing services, and peer support.

Located in Edinburgh, the House of Hope is the first bespoke breast cancer support and wellbeing centre in Scotland. While the NHS provides crucial medical care, it lacks the resources to offer additional holistic support, leaving many patients and their families in need of emotional and therapeutic assistance. This is where the House of Hope steps in, bridging the gap and ensuring that no one faces breast cancer alone.

Lisa's inspiration for the House of Hope came from the Future Dreams House in London – a similar initiative that provided her with strength and encouragement during her journey. Now, she is determined to offer the same support to others in Scotland.



The Scotto & JCT Partnership: Turning a Dream into Reality

The House of Hope officially became a JCT charity partner in December 2024, but the collaboration began much earlier, with JCT supporting the charity during its initial setup phase in 2023. To date, JCT has provided £51,500 in funding, with £50,000 granted in 2024 alone. This financial backing has been instrumental in securing and renovating the physical space that will soon become a refuge for so many.

The funding has directly contributed to:

- Securing the property in Edinburgh.
- Initial renovations to create a welcoming and supportive environment.
- Planning the development of wellbeing and therapeutic services.

A Glimpse into the Future:

Building a Supportive Community

December 2024 was a landmark moment for House of Hope as they received the keys to their new centre. The Scotto team was invited to visit the property, offering a firsthand look at the transformation in progress. The visit was an emotional and inspiring day, allowing Lisa and her team to share their vision for the centre while showcasing how each space would be used to support individuals on their breast cancer journey.

The Scotto team also took this opportunity to film key moments, capturing the passion and dedication behind the project. During the visit, they met some of the incredible individuals driving this initiative forward:

- **Euan, Lisa's husband and Co-chairperson:**

A specialist in charity law with nearly two decades of experience, Euan has witnessed firsthand the challenges that come with a breast cancer diagnosis – not just for patients but for their families as well. His legal expertise and personal connection to the cause make him an integral part of the charity's leadership.

- **Hazel, Centre Manager:**

With nearly a decade of experience in the charity sector, Hazel brings a wealth of knowledge, compassion, and enthusiasm to the House of Hope. Having worked closely with families affected by cancer through the Team Jak Foundation, Hazel understands the importance of creating a nurturing environment. She is eager to bring Lisa's vision to life and build strong relationships within the House of Hope community.



During the visit, there was also a surprise moment that left the House of Hope team overjoyed – The Scotto presented them with a £50,000 cheque, a pivotal boost that will help propel the project towards opening day.



Looking ahead:

A Brighter Future for those Facing Breast Cancer

As the House of Hope prepares to open its doors in 2025, the charity remains focused on its goal: providing a safe, welcoming space where individuals can find solace, community, and holistic support tailored to their needs. Through fully funded workshops, therapy sessions, and peer support groups, the centre aims to reduce social isolation and empower those facing breast cancer to navigate their journey with strength and hope.

The Jackpot Community Trust has pledged continued support for the House of Hope in 2025, ensuring that this vital initiative continues to grow and thrive. With each step forward, the charity moves closer to making its vision a reality – one where every individual impacted by breast cancer has

access to the care, connection, and comfort they deserve.

As the renovations progress and the doors prepare to open, one thing is certain: The House of Hope is set to become a beacon of strength, love, and healing for the Scottish breast cancer community, ensuring that no one walks their journey alone.

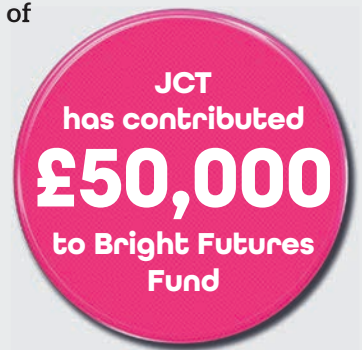

Building Brighter Futures: **The Impact of the Bright Futures Fund**

The Jackpot Community Trust (JCT) is committed to supporting communities across Scotland by funding initiatives that create meaningful change. Our work spans a wide range of causes, from tackling poverty and inequality to promoting education, health, and community development. Among our many priorities, we recognise the importance of supporting children and young people, ensuring they have the opportunities and resources needed to build a brighter future.



One of the key initiatives we have helped bring to life is the Bright Futures Fund – a joint venture between JCT and the Scottish Children's Lottery Trust (SCLT). Launched in 2024, this fund was created to provide targeted financial support to charities working directly with children and young people, particularly those facing disadvantage. Through this collaboration, we have helped deliver 99 grants in the fund's first year alone, positively impacting the lives of more than 15,000 children across Scotland.

This initiative is more than just financial assistance; it's about empowering communities, removing barriers, and ensuring that young people, no matter their background, have access to opportunities that can shape their future.

A Collaborative Approach to Change

JCT and SCLT share a common goal: to create meaningful and lasting change for young people facing disadvantage. While JCT provides vital funding – made possible through proceeds from The Scotto – SCLT manages the grant distribution process, ensuring funds reach the charities that need them most.

By working together, we've simplified the funding process, making it accessible to smaller charities that often struggle to secure financial support. The result is a fund that is efficient, impactful, and responsive to the evolving needs of Scotland's communities.

Empowering Scotland's Young People

The Bright Futures Fund supports a wide range of projects that create opportunities for children and young people. Here are just a few of the inspiring initiatives we've helped fund:

Keeping Scotland's Musical Heritage Alive

Garnock Valley Pipes and Drums received funding to continue offering free chanter and snare drum lessons to young people in the Garnock Valley. This initiative ensures that around 50 children have access to high-quality music education, fostering not only musical talent but also discipline, teamwork, and confidence.

Championing Leadership and Inclusion

Diversity Bridge SCIO was awarded funding for its Youth Leadership Development Programme, designed to empower vulnerable young people aged 14 to 18. The programme focuses on leadership training, mentorship, and community engagement, with a particular emphasis on supporting young people from ethnic minority backgrounds, refugees, and asylum seekers.



Edward Obi, Chief Bridge Builder at Diversity Bridge SCIO, highlighted the significance of this support:

"This funding is a step forward in our mission to equip young people with essential leadership skills while fostering inclusivity within Scottish communities."

Breaking Barriers Through Sport

Clyde FC Community Foundation is using its grant to deliver after-school football clubs in schools that lack the resources to fund extracurricular activities. These clubs, running at Carbrain Primary in Cumbernauld and Haghill Park Primary in Glasgow, promote healthy lifestyles and literacy, offering structured and inclusive activities to children who might not otherwise have access.

Alan White, Charity Development Manager at Clyde FC Community Foundation, explained:

“Through this funding, we can provide after-school clubs in areas where financial barriers exist, ensuring children in disadvantaged communities have access to the benefits of sport.”

Supporting Children with Disabilities

Bright Sparks SCIO, based in Midlothian, provides youth clubs for children and young people with disabilities. With support from the Bright Futures Fund, they are able to enhance their evening club activities, offering a safe and inclusive space where young people can engage in adaptive outdoor play, arts and crafts, board games, and sensory experiences.

Jennifer Martin, Operations Manager at Bright Sparks SCIO, shared the impact of the funding:

“This support allows us to continue providing children with disabilities the opportunity to play, learn, and connect in a secure and welcoming environment.”
